LAKES REPORT

BBV's lakes continue to unfold their promise. In July, the first "Annual Paddleboat Regatta" drew five of the foot-propelled watercraft to a celebration cruise around Thunderbird Lake. The number of kayaks slicing the surf continues to increase. Remote control model sailboats are seen in racing formations, with maturing carp breaking the surface among them. Experienced fishermen estimate the carps' length at up to 24". Objective observers estimate it at 16". And our first 'Man o' War' (unarmed), flying pennants from around the world, was launched onto Thunderbird on August 12th, with appropriate fanfare. The small, sleek sloop, built and captained by Rick Whitaker, will be seen under sail as it completes its sea trials.

Other matters: A new accessory for BBV's Kubota all-purpose tractor will allow easier removal of some patches of lakefront blackberry bushes that also host a variety of deadly nightshade.

A lakes monitoring report from WWU's Institute of Watershed Studies indicates the dissolved oxygen content of the lakes is lower than recommended. The problem reflects several factors: aging aeration pods; clogged pipes between the golf course ponds and the lakes; and the unnatural contours of the ponds and lakes themselves, which impede circulation. The failed pods are being repaired and/or replaced in-house by Village Maintenance Staff and Volunteers. Finding and curing the pipe blockages has been contracted to a specialist firm. Lake levels have been lowered temporarily to permit camera and tool access to the pipes. Water levels will return to normal, hopefully with improved circulation and oxygenation, as autumn rainfall replaces the deficit. On the good news side, lake turbidity (cloudiness) is lower than ever before, and very low coliform readings by WWU confirm they are well within limits for recreational use.

With the annual winter migration of its 'snowbird' members looming, the Lakes Committee is anxious to fill the vacancy left by departing member Bob Hodges. Bob, a chemical engineer specializing in major water-related projects, has been an invaluable tutor and guide since the Committee's birth. We cannot thank him enough for all he has contributed.


