

Board & Committee Volunteer Commitment in 2023

Boards and its committees have performed volunteer services for the Village for many years. Most community associations rely on their volunteers to do some of the work it takes to maintain, manage and govern what amounts to a small town in Birch Bay Village's case. In 2023, the board and its committees provided over 5,000 hours of volunteer work. If these committed community members did not sign up for duty, the work would still need to be done, either by contractors or paid staff. Doing some very simple math, paying a conservative \$20/hr for the 5,000 hours of work amounts to \$100,000 less in dues than would otherwise need to be charged to members, saving each member about \$90/year.

But just because most of these committees have always been a service to the community does not guarantee their future. The Architectural Control, Building & Grounds, Safety & Security, Golf, Lakes & Drainage, Marina, Service & Social committees all could use volunteers to bolster their ranks. Please consider volunteering in the New Year for a committee that interests you. You will be helping your community and yourself as well. There are many studies that show positive health effects of volunteerism. Make signing up to join a BBVVCC committee your first New Year's resolution.

It has been an amazing four months as General Manager here at Birch Bay Village. It started with a welcome from the members, unlike any other I had previously experienced. Welcome parties, free crab, people stopping in the office just to say, "hello and welcome". Since then, I have been impressed by the hard work and dedication of a caring staff and host of community-minded volunteers who have continually stepped up to help a new manager find his way. SECURITY POLICY WORKGROUP UPDATE



As noted in the October Bulletin, the Birch Bay Village Board of Directors established a temporary working group to research and make recommendations for an integrated security policy.

The Security Policy Workgroup's primary goal is to seek efficient and cost-effective ways to enable Birch Bay Village owners and residents to continue experiencing the relatively safe residential & recreational environment the community has taken for granted over the years. The group is assisted in an advisory capacity by General Manager David Franklin and BBV's Public Safety Patrol and Compliance Coordinator, Lowell English. The group's liaison to the Board of Directors is Dave Owen, founder of ACT Safety Services LLC.

Included are representatives from the four Committees most directly concerned with security and safety issues related to BBV's common areas (our 13 miles of private roads, our parks and other recreational facilities, and our shared buildings). The participating representatives from the Building and Grounds Committee, Golf Committee, Marina Committee and Safety & Security Committee have been investigating four key areas that should be inter-linked to ensure a cohesive program. These four areas include Signage, Gates & Fences, Video Camera Systems, and Patrol/Entry Supervision Services). Outside industry experts are being consulted by the workgroup in each of these areas.

When assessed, planned and budgeted for as a coordinated effort in an integrated program, these previously-disparate security resource elements can be administered in a more efficient and cost-effective manner. As just one example, the Security Policy Workgroup has identified more than 16 different security cameras inside BBV, but they are linked to 5 different local systems. They were installed at different times for varying purposes, with little inter-connection and no single, common access point for recording and monitoring. Nearly half are currently inoperative. This is one obvious area for improvement, as ways are sought to rebuild and improve BBV security assets.

At present we are still blessed with relative safety from property theft. A property owner is 14 times more likely to experience property crime (burglary or theft) in the nearby region <u>outside</u> Birch Bay Village, than inside our gates. However the Whatcom County Sheriff's Office Crime Statistics Dashboard shows that in the larger unincorporated Birch Bay Census Area (about 10,620 residents), property crimes are a growing issue of concern. In a recent 30-day reporting period (October 30-November 29, 2023), burglaries were up 75% and thefts were up 50% year-on-year compared to the same period in 2022. Fortunately this disturbing trend has not yet made significant inroads past the BBV community boundaries. Now is an appropriate time for all to consider ways to help keep it that way.

Do you believe that around-the-clock security patrols, while quite costly, are still worthwhile? Or do you feel your HOA dues are better spent in other areas? Do you feel that traffic-rule violations should be ignored, or do you wish they were more directly enforced as they were in the recent past? Are you interested in and willing to help re-establish BBV's Neighborhood Blockwatch Program, which has not been active for several years now?

All input received will be considered as part of this team-based effort as it works to conclusion. Additionally, the Security Policy Workgroup is coordinating with the Board of Directors for an upcoming Town Hall meeting. The purpose of this event will be to gather additional input and comments from BBV property owners. It's planned to soon announce a date for this hybrid live/online meeting at the Clubhouse in February.
