### GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The following is a brief summary of the GM report given at the 02-15-2024 Board Of Directors

#### **ADMINISTRATION:**

- Annual Dues Billing and processing has been the dominant activity for the administrative staff. Management and staff will investigate ways to streamline process.
- BBVCC Election Manual development is underway thanks to the efforts of the Board Secretary, Election Committee and GM. Additionally, the Election Committee tested three online voting platforms for possible use in BBVCC elections
- IT Clean-Up is still underway with Phase One the transfer of data from an onsite server to a cloudbased server - completed. Phase Two -the set up workstations - is almost complete. Phase Three will be organizing file structures and populating shared file folders so information is accessible by the entire organization.
- Maintenance has been busy with various winter tasks. Including:
  - Front gate landscape demo and prep for spring planting
  - New freezer for Rec center
  - New range for clubhouse
  - Facilities maintenance and deep cleaning
  - Smoke alarm upgrades
  - Winter weather prep- preparing plow and sander, covering sand, readying de icer, placing snow staffs at high driveways and other obstructions to aid plowing.
  - New plow on UTV
  - Storm cleanup, log removal
  - Starting to repair lake bubblers for Kwann lake
  - Storm response (on going)
- Marina Dock Replacement was temporarily halted during the January Winter storm. Adverse conditions and a frozen marina made it impossible to move boats or work outside. Work resumed once conditions improved and the project is on schedule with the completion of C-Dock scheduled for the end of February.
- Dredging Project was also delayed by the January Winter storm but was completed Sunday, February 4th, 2024. The delay proved beneficial in that it allowed us to obtain a permit to dredge an additional area previously denied by the Whatcom County.
- The Security Policy Work Group Town Hall presentation on February 6th was attended by 47 community members in person and another 65 online. Information collected over the past five months regarding the current status of the Village security and recommendations to the community based on that data. Questions were taken from both audiences and a survey developed to assist the Board better understand members concerns. The Workgroup was composed of members of each of the Village's standing committees, our Compliance Officer, GM and Board of Directors Liaison.

### **OTHER ACTIVITIES:**

"Baton Building"-Since the Board Retreat in November of 2023, the GM has been focused on the lack of written or documented standard operating procedures, policies, and protocols. In effect, there are very few "batons" to hand off to a new employee, committee members or board members. The result is a constant reinventing of the wheel, inconsistent delivery of services, general confusion and inefficient deployment of resources.

This is a situation that will not be corrected overnight, but progress has already been made. Some examples of this progress are:

- newly developed Election Manual by the Election Committee
- the Committee Working Group developing committee charters, standardization of reports and
- Landscape Plans Documenting of plans, projects (including objectives), plants, and irrigation system lay-outs by Maintenance Supervisor, Landscape Manager and GM
- The development of "Post Orders" for Front Gate personnel by the SecPol Group, GM, members of the Safety & Security Committee and Prime Security.

### Update on Emergency Flood Preparedness: Diesel Pump and Lower Salish, January snowfall and atmospheric river events.

We want to share with you how we are being proactive in establishing awareness of potential flooding on lower Salish Rd. We had a great example of how effective our plan is during the melting of 12-14 inches of snow in mid -January, and then again with the atmospheric river (extra-heavy rainfall) that was predicted for January 27-28th.

#### Volunteer Watch Team

The Lakes, Ponds and Drainage Committee has established a watch team that looks at tide charts and rain/snow accumulation to assess the timing of potential flooding on lower Salish Rd. We have a chain of command established, and the team's point person is rotated weekly. There are also several text groups set up and we have a volunteer pump activation team.

In mid-January, we had 12-14 inches of snow during very cold weather, that

also included some higher-than-usual predicted tides. By January 19, 2024 the snow was starting to melt and there was concern for the rain to accelerate the melt. (creating the possibility of a large water runoff combined with high tides) and it would happen on a weekend. The decision was proactively

made for Bob Hoffer and the maintenance team to deploy the diesel pump hoses. They also checked the pump battery voltage and diesel fuel levels and test-started it for cold weather operation. The maintenance crew will start the pump when indicated, and for backup there is a trained team of 8 BBV resident volunteers. Deploying the hoses in advance makes it much easier to activate the pump, since the hoses are heavy and awkward to roll out.



There is a water-level measuring gauge set up in the ditch at the Emergency gate. This gauge has markings on it to indicate when water may potentially start flowing into residents' yards. This data is used to determine when the pump should be turned on, this is a black line at the 1.75 feet mark. Pictures are taken of the gauge and texted to others in the group, (see picture example) and also shared with the L&D Committee members via that text group.

Watch vigilance continued, due to the predicted January 27-28th atmospheric river. This timely sharing of information, and knowledge that the pump was ready to go during these high-risk times, greatly decreased the stress for residents on lower fallich Ed., and was much appreciated by them. Participation

dents on lower Salish Rd., and was much appreciated by them. Participation of the residents on Salish Rd. was extremely valuable. This helped reduce the number of times L&D Committee members needed to go down to the ditch and check rising or falling water levels.

### Acknowledgment of Support

We are grateful for the combination of caring and interested people, including the BBV maintenance team, many residents who live along Salish Rd., and the L&D Committee members who monitor this gauge. We want to acknowledge and thank them for their participation. Thank you all so much for your help. I love the adage..." It takes a Village"... yes, it does, and we certainly have a good one!!

## Prepare Year

### 3. Water



ater quickly becomes a precious resource following many disasters. It is vital that all household members learn how to shut off the water at the main house valve so that you don't lose clean water which you could use. The effects of gravity may drain the water in your hot water and toilet tanks unless you trap it in your house by shutting off the main house valve (not the street valve in the cement box at the curb – this valve is extremely difficult to turn and requires a special tool).

Label this valve with a tag for easy identification, and make sure all household members know where it is located.

In addition to storing water, be aware of your surroundings and where you can find other sources of water. Available water sources include hot water heaters, toilet tanks, streams, lakes, rivers, etc. Consider adding a water filter to your kits so that you can safely use water you find.

### How much water should I store?

For your household, we recommend at least two weeks' worth of water. That's one gallon per person per day to take care of drinking, cooking and hygiene needs. You might need less depending on your cooking methods and if you're using wet wipes for hygiene. Plan to drink at minimum one quart of water per person per day. Remember to have water for your pets, too!

### Which containers should I use?

Plastic containers with a screw-cap lid, such as two-liter soda pop bottles or food-grade plastic jugs, work great.

Don't use glass bottles or old bleach bottles (or any container that has held a toxic substance).

Avoid the use of plastic milk jugs. (They are difficult to seal tightly, and their plastic becomes very fragile and brittle over time).

### Storing Water

We know storing 14 gallons per person is difficult, especially for large families. Having food that will not use water is one way to minimize water storage.

Consider multiple locations to store water, especially if in an apartment or small house. Thoroughly rinse out the container and the lid with water and fill it to the very top of the container. For extra safety, thoroughly rinse the container with a weak solution of liquid chlorine bleach (8-10 drops in two cups

water). Empty this solution out and fill the container right to the top with fresh water.

- Seal the container tightly.
- Label it "Drinking Water" and date it.
- Store it in a cool, dark place.



Distillation – One method of purification in addition to filters and purification tablets

- 1. Fill a pot halfway with water.
- Tie a cup to the handle on the pot's lid so that the cup will hang right-side up when the lid is placed upside-down on the pot (make sure the cup is not dangling in the water).
- Boil the water for 20 minutes. The water that drips from the lid into the cup is distilled.

This method allows the vapor resulting from boiling water to collect in the cup. This condensed vapor will not include salts or other impurities.

### Is adding liquid bleach recommended?

The Food and Drug Administration and the Environmental Protection Agency says that tap water does not need anything added to it before it is stored because it has already been chemically treated. Commercially purchased water does not need anything added to it. Keep it in its original, sealed container. It is recommended that stored tap water be rotated every 6 months. Commercially sealed water is safe for up to two years; some are labeled for longer storage. The only thing that should be used to

purify water is liquid household bleach containing 6 percent sodium hypochlorite and no thickeners, soaps or scents.

Boiling water kills bacteria, viruses, and parasites that can cause illness. Treating water with chlorine bleach kills most viruses, but will probably not kill bacteria. Therefore, boiling and then adding chlorine bleach is an effective water purification method.
